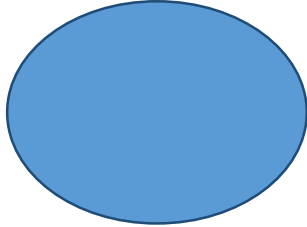


## English: the difference between adverbs and adjectives

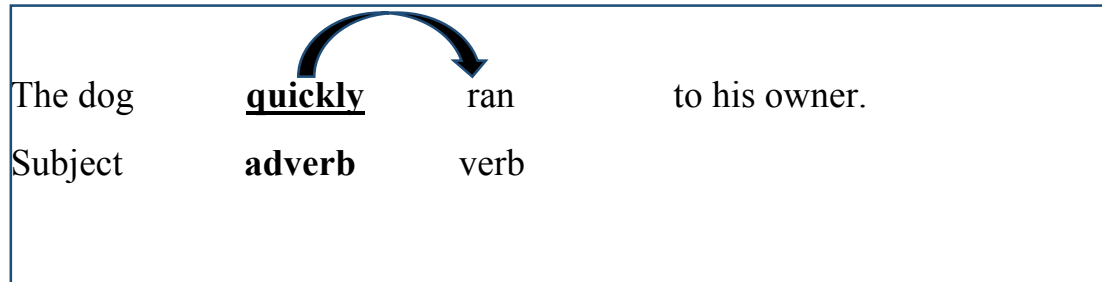

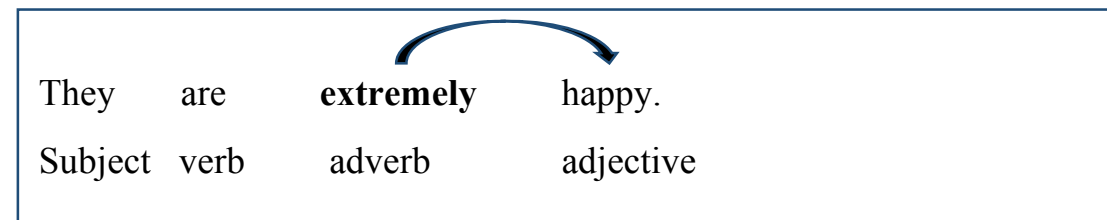
