# WHAT IS A PHRASAL VERB?

A phrasal verb is a verb that with an adverb or a preposition modify or give new meaning to the verb.

VERB + ADVERB OR PREPOSITION

turn off

turn up

get up

get along with

try on

look for



# TYPES OF PHRASAL VERBS

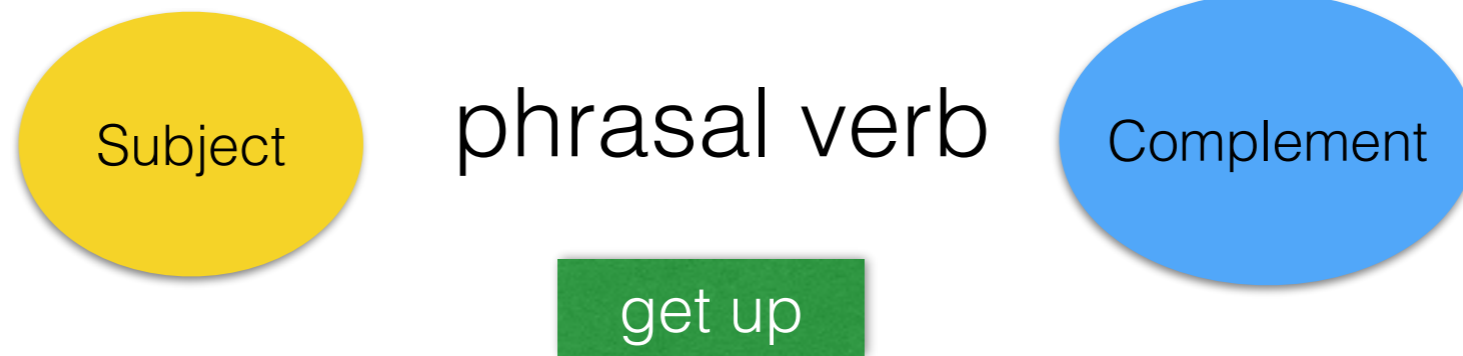

# Type one

This type of phrasal verb does not have an object.



I get up at 6:00 am.

get up

come on

go away

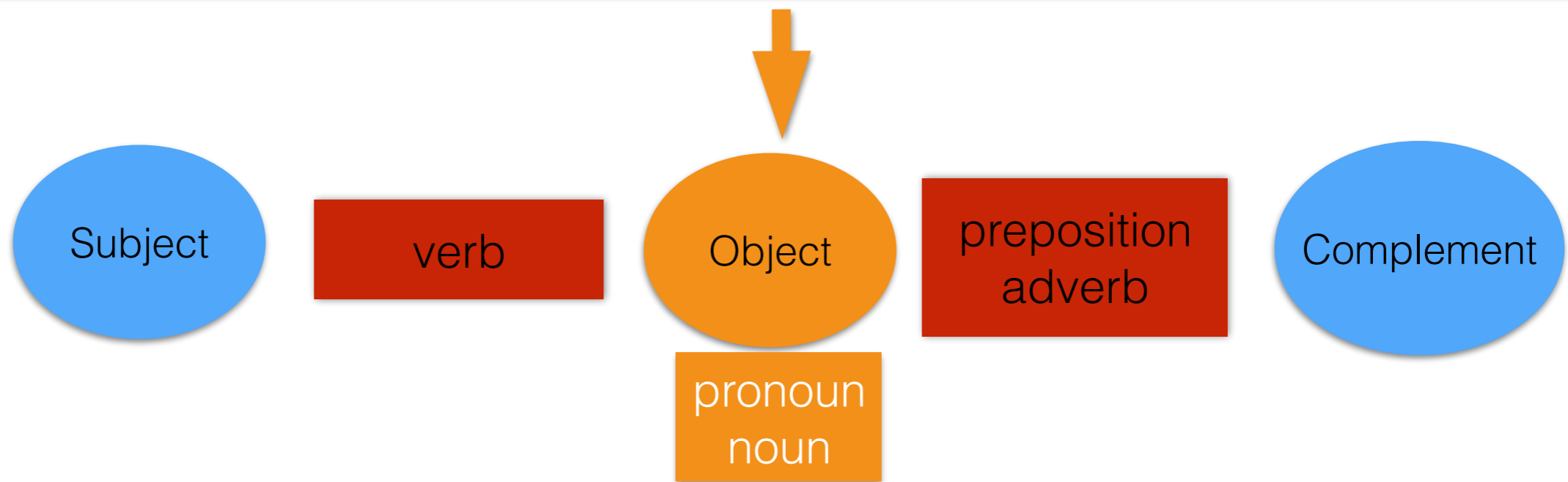
go out

stand up

sit down

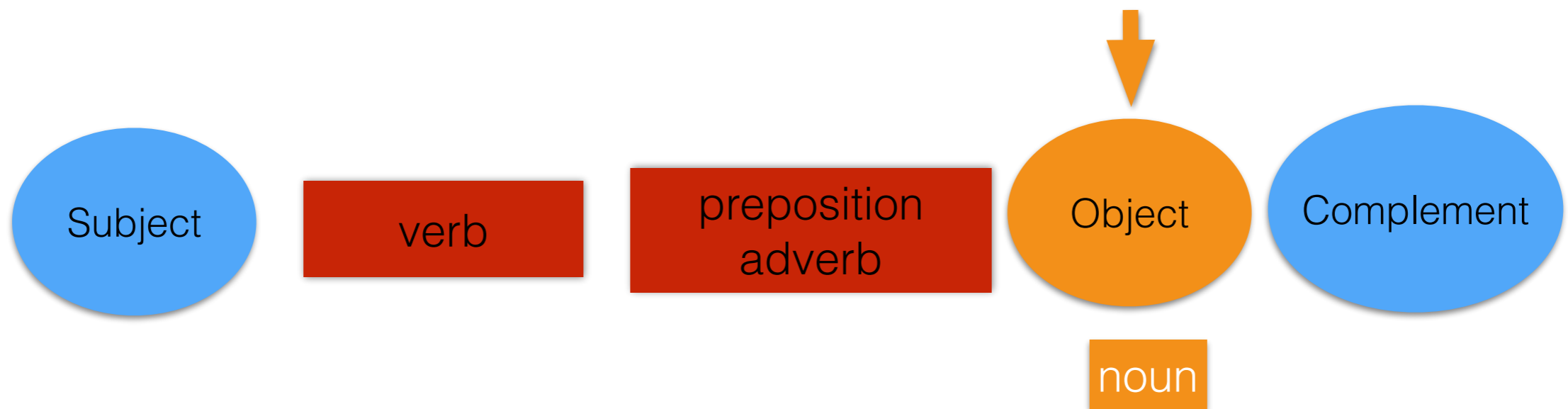
# Type Two

This type of phrasal verb has an object. It can be separated.



I will pick you up at 3:00 pm.

I picked Mark up at 10:00 am. yesterday.



I picked up Mark at 10:00 am.

# Type Two

This type of phrasal verb has an object.

# Type Two

This type of phrasal verb has an object.

turn on

turn off

give back

call back

pay back

write down

take back

give up

put away

pick up

throw away

turn up/down

look up

fill out

find out

put on

take off

try on

When these phrasal verbs are separated the pronoun is placed ONLY in the middle.

Turn  on.

Not: ~~Turn on it.~~

Throw  away.

Not: ~~Throw away them.~~

NOUNS can be used in the middle or after the phrasal verb.

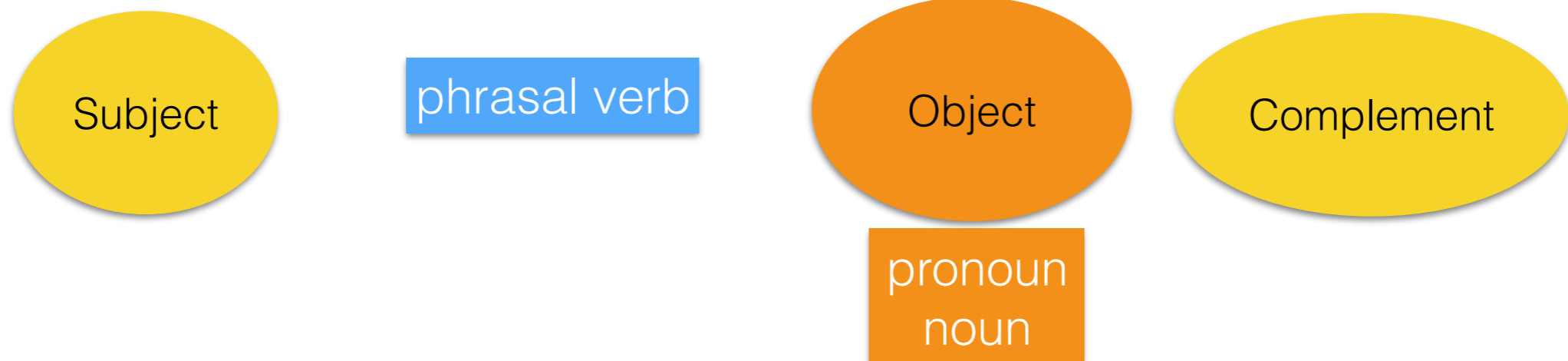
Turn on the radio.

Throw away the papers.



## Type Three

This type of phrasal verb has an object. It cannot be separated.



I looked for my glasses all morning.

I looked for them all morning.

look after

looking forward to

look for

get on/ off

get along with
